

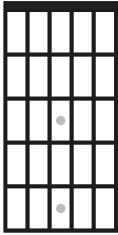
Alternate tunings are any combination of notes that do not use the standard (E-B-G-D-A-E) tuning.

The most common associated with acoustic guitar are open tunings e.g. the strings are tuned to a chord e.g. open G, drop tunings including drop D which requires the 6th string to be detuned to a D, or double drop D which requires both E strings to be detuned and miscellaneous variations such as DADGAD or Celtic tuning.
